For cultures that require storage in liquid nitrogen, it is important to note that some vials may leak when submersed in liquid nitrogen and will slowly fill with liquid nitrogen. Upon thawing, the conversion of the liquid nitrogen back to its gas phase may result in the vial exploding or blowing off its cap with dangerous force creating flying debris. Unless necessary, ATCC recommends that these cultures be stored in the vapor phase of liquid nitrogen rather than submersed in liquid nitrogen.

Handling Procedures

Frozen ampoules packed in dry ice should either be thawed immediately or stored in liquid nitrogen. If liquid nitrogen storage facilities are not available, frozen ampoules may be stored at or below -70°C for approximately one week. **Do not under any circumstance store frozen ampoules at refrigerator freezer temperatures** (generally -20°C). Storage of frozen material at this temperature may result in the death of the culture.



Frozen vials should either be thawed immediately or stored in liquid nitrogen. If liquid nitrogen storage facilities are not available, frozen vials may be stored at or below -70°C. **Do not under any circumstance store frozen vials at refrigerator freezer temperatures (generally -20°C) for long-term storage.** Long-term storage of frozen material at this temperature will result in the death of the culture.

- 1. To thaw a frozen vial, place it at room temperature or in 30°C water bath (not submerged), until just thawed (around90 seconds).
- 2. Immediately after thawing, aseptically transfer the culture into a test tube or plate with medium recommended.
- 3. Incubate the test tube or plate at the temperature recommended (25-28°C).
