Upon thawing, the conversion of the liquid nitrogen back to its gas phase may result in the vial exploding or blowing off its cap with dangerous force creating flying debris. Unless necessary, ATCC recommends that these cultures be stored in the vapor phase of liquid nitrogen rather than submersed in liquid nitrogen.

**Medium:** ATCC Medium 44: Brain Heart Infusion Agar/Broth **Temperature:** 37°C

## Handling Procedures

1. Open vial according to enclosed instructions.

2. From a single tube of #44 broth (5 to 6 ml), withdraw approximately 0.5 to 1.0 ml with a Pasteur or 1.0 ml pipette and use to rehydrate the entire pellet.

3. Aseptically transfer the rehydrated pellet back into the broth tube. Mix well.

4. Use several drops of this suspension to inoculate an additional broth tube, a #44 agar slant and/or a plate.

5. Incubate the tubes and plate at 37°C for 24 to 48 hours.

#### Notes

Colonies on #44 plates are entire, glistening, smooth, low convex, opaque, and vary in size.
