Upon thawing, the conversion of the liquid nitrogen back to its gas phase may result in the vial exploding or blowing off its cap with dangerous force creating flying debris. Unless necessary, ATCC recommends that these cultures be stored in the vapor phase of liquid nitrogen rather than submerged in liquid nitrogen.

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### **Growth Conditions**

**Medium:**

ATCC Medium 3: Nutrient agar or nutrient broth

**Temperature:** 26°C

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### **Handling Procedures**

- 1. Open vial according to enclosed instructions.**
- 2. Using a single tube of #3 broth (5 to 6 ml), withdraw approximately 0.5 to 1.0 ml with a Pasteur or glass pipet. Rehydrate the entire pellet.**
- 3. Transfer this aliquot back into the broth tube. Mix well.**
- 4. Use several drops of the suspension to inoculate a second tube of broth, a slant,**

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and/or plate.

**5. Incubate all tubes and plate at 26°C for 3 to 5 days.**

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### **Notes**

Three colony types are observed. Small, dull colonies, some with an entire margin and others with a rhizoid margin, as well as larger, smooth, glistening colonies. Cells can vary from long, medium, to short rods, and occur singly, in pairs or V-formations, in stacks, or in clusters.
