ATCC highly recommends that appropriate personal protective equipment is always used when handling vials. For cultures that require storage in liquid nitrogen, it is important to note that some vials may leak when submersed in liquid nitrogen and will slowly fill with liquid nitrogen. Upon thawing, the conversion of the liquid nitrogen back to its gas phase may result in the vial exploding or blowing off its cap with dangerous force creating flying debris. Unless necessary, ATCC recommends that these cultures be stored in the vapor phase of liquid nitrogen rather than submersed in liquid nitrogen.

Handling Procedures

1. Open the vial according to enclosed instructions.

2. From a single tube of the recommended broth (5 to 6 ml), withdraw approximately0.5 to 1.0 ml with a Pasteur or 1.0 ml pipette and use to rehydrate the entire pellet.

3. Aseptically transfer the rehydrated pellet back into the broth tube. Mix well.

4. Use several drops of this suspension to inoculate a second tube of broth, a slant,

and/or a plate.

5. Incubate all tubes and plate at 37°C for 24 to 48 hours.

Notes

Growth is generally best in broth or on biphasic slants and may be poor on agar plates and slants. Colonies are entire, glistening, and smooth.
