## **Description**

*Mycobacterium* sp. is a bacterium that was isolated in Brazil from a lizard.

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## **Intended Use**

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## **BSL 2**

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ATCC highly recommends that appropriate personal protective equipment is always used when handling vials. For cultures that require storage in liquid nitrogen, it is

important to note that some vials may leak when submersed in liquid nitrogen and will slowly fill with liquid nitrogen. Upon thawing, the conversion of the liquid nitrogen back to its gas phase may result in the vial exploding or blowing off its cap with dangerous force creating flying debris. Unless necessary, ATCC recommends that these cultures be stored in the vapor phase of liquid nitrogen rather than submersed in liquid nitrogen.

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## Growth Conditions

### Medium:

ATCC Medium 1395: Middlebrook 7H9 broth with ADC enrichment

ATCC Medium 0173: Middlebrook 7H10 Agar w/ OADC

ATCC Medium 90: Lowenstein Jenson medium

**Temperature:** 37°C

**Atmosphere:** Aerobic

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## Handling Procedures

1. Open vial.
2. Using a single tube of #1395 broth (5 to 6 ml), withdraw approximately 0.5 to 1.0 ml with a Pasteur or 1.0 ml pipette. Rehydrate the entire pellet.
3. Aseptically transfer this aliquot back into the broth tube. Mix well.
4. Use several drops of the suspension to inoculate a #173 or #90 agar slant and a #173 plate.

5. Incubate the tubes and plate at 37°C for at least 7 days.
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## Notes

Colonies on #173 plates are white in center, buff, irregular, opaque, erose, convex, dull, mostly rough, with a few smooth.
