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ATCC highly recommends that appropriate personal protective equipment is always used when handling vials. For cultures that require storage in liquid nitrogen, it is important to note that some vials may leak when submersed in liquid nitrogen and will slowly fill with liquid nitrogen. Upon thawing, the conversion of the liquid nitrogen back to its gas phase may result in the vial exploding or blowing off its cap

with dangerous force creating flying debris. Unless necessary, ATCC recommends that these cultures be stored in the vapor phase of liquid nitrogen rather than submersed in liquid nitrogen.

## **Growth Conditions**

Medium: ATCC Medium 2107: Modified Reinforced Clostridial ATCC Medium 260: Trypticase soy agar/broth with defibrinated sheep blood Temperature: 37°C Atmosphere: Anaerobic

## Handling Procedures

- 1. Open vial according to enclosed instructions.
- 2. Under anaerobic conditions, withdraw 0.5 mL of #2107 broth from a single test tube (5 to 6 mL) and rehydrate the entire vial contents.
- 3. Aseptically transfer this aliquot back into the broth tube. Additional tubes may be inoculated with 0.5 mL each from the suspension. A slant and or plate may

also be inoculated with 0.2 mL. Streak a blood plate to check for purity.

4. Incubate tubes and agar under anaerobic conditions at 37°C. Incubate the blood plate aerobically for an aerobic contamination check.

#### ANAEROBIC CONDITIONS:

Anaerobic conditions for transfer may be obtained by either of the following:

- Use of an anaerobic gas chamber, or
- Placement of test tubes under a gassing cannula system connected to anaerobic gas.

Anaerobic conditions for incubation may be obtained by any of the following:

- Loose screw caps on test tubes in anaerobic chamber,
- Loose screw caps on test tubes in an activated anaerobic gas pack jar, or
- Use of sterile butyl rubber stoppers on test tubes so that an anaerobic gas headspace is retained.

#### Notes

The depositor states that this item requires a growth factor found in human milk, however we have successfully cultivated it on #2107 Broth: Reinforced Clostridial Medium (BD 218081). Growth should occur in 48 hours. No growth should appear on the agar plate incubated aerobically.
