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ATCC highly recommends that appropriate personal protective equipment is always used when handling vials. For cultures that require storage in liquid nitrogen, it is important to note that some vials may leak when submersed in liquid nitrogen and will slowly fill with liquid nitrogen. Upon thawing, the conversion of the liquid nitrogen back to its gas phase may result in the vial exploding or blowing off its cap with dangerous force creating flying debris. Unless necessary, ATCC recommends that these cultures be stored in the vapor phase of liquid nitrogen rather than submersed in liquid nitrogen.

Growth Conditions

Medium:

ATCC Medium 3: Nutrient agar or nutrient broth

Temperature: 26°C

Handling Procedures

- 1. Open vial according to enclosed instructions.
- 2. Using a single tube of #3 broth (5 to 6 ml), withdraw approximately 0.5 to 1.0 ml with a Pasteur or 1.0 ml pipette. Rehydrate pellet.
- 3. Aseptically transfer this aliquot back into the broth tube. Mix well.
- 4. Incubate at 26°C for 48 hours with shaking.



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5. After growth has been achieved, use several drops of the suspension to inoculate a second tube of broth, a slant, and/or plate.

Notes

Culture grows better in broth with aeration. Cells are spiral shaped and highly motile.

This strain displays two colony types after 48 hours incubation: a) 75% circular, smooth, entire, convex, glistening, translucent; and b) 25% irregular, flat, rough, and transparent. Colony type b is a variant that has lost the ability to form helical cells (see Bergeys Manual of Systematic Bacteriology, Vol. 1, 1984, pg. 73). Biochemical characterization and the fatty acid profile are identical for both types.
