## **Description**

*Collimonas* sp. strain NCIB 7917 is a bacterium that was isolated in England from lake water.

Upon thawing, the conversion of the liquid nitrogen back to its gas phase may result in the vial exploding or blowing off its cap with dangerous force creating flying debris. Unless necessary, ATCC recommends that these cultures be stored in the vapor phase of liquid nitrogen rather than submersed in liquid nitrogen.

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## Growth Conditions

**Medium:**

ATCC Medium 3: Nutrient agar or nutrient broth

**Temperature:** 20°C

**Atmosphere:** Aerobic

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## Handling Procedures

1. Open vial.
2. Rehydrate the entire pellet with approximately 0.5 mL of #3 broth. Aseptically transfer the entire contents to a 5-6 mL tube of #3 broth. Additional test tubes can be inoculated by transferring 0.5 mL of the primary broth tube to these secondary tubes.

3. Use several drops of the primary broth tube to inoculate a #3 plate and/or #3 agar slant.
  4. Incubate at 20°C for 3-5 days.
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## Notes

Culture grows in 3-5 days, but purple pigment may take a week to fully develop.
