Unless necessary, ATCC recommends that these cultures be stored in the vapor phase of liquid nitrogen rather than submersed in liquid nitrogen.

Handling Procedures

- 1. Open thawed vial.
- 2. Aseptically transfer the entire contents to a 5-6 mL tube of #1395 broth.

Additional test tubes can be inoculated by transferring 0.5 mL of the primary broth tube to these secondary tubes.

- 3. Use several drops of the primary broth tube to inoculate a #173 plate and/or #90 agar slant.
- 4. Incubate at 30°C for 2-6 weeks.

Notes

This item is a very slow grower. The best growth is achieved on ATCC Medium #90 after 4-6 weeks. Growth on ATCC Medium #173 agar takes at least 6 weeks.
