Upon thawing, the conversion of the liquid nitrogen back to its gas phase may result in the vial exploding or blowing off its cap with dangerous force creating flying debris. Unless necessary, ATCC recommends that these cultures be stored in the vapor phase of liquid nitrogen rather than submersed in liquid nitrogen.

Handling Procedures

- 1. Open vial according to enclosed instructions.
- 2. Under anaerobic conditions, withdraw 0.5 mL of #1053 from a single test tube (5 to 6 mL) and rehydrate the entire vial contents.
- 3. Aseptically transfer this aliquot back into the broth tube. Additional tubes may be inoculated with 0.5 mL each from the suspension. A slant of #1053 may also be inoculated with 0.2 mL. Streak several blood plates to check for colonial morphology and purity.
- 4. Incubate tubes under an anaerobic atmosphere at 37°C. Incubate one agar plate anaerobically for colony formation, and one aerobically for aerobic contamination check.

ANAEROBIC CONDITIONS:

Anaerobic conditions for transfer may be obtained by either of the following:

- Use of an anaerobic gas chamber, or
- Placement of test tubes under a gassing cannula system hooked to anaerobic gas.

Anaerobic conditions for incubation may be obtained by any of the following:

- Loose screw caps on test tubes in anaerobic chamber,
- Loose screw caps on test tubes in an activated anaerobic gas pack jar, or
- Use of sterile butyl rubber stoppers on test tubes so that an anaerobic gas headspace is retained.

Notes



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Within 24 hours, growth should be evident by good turbidity and gas in the broth. Colonies on the anaerobic blood plate are glistening, smooth, and have irregular, lobate spreading margins. No growth should occur on the blood agar plate incubated aerobically.

The presence of cpa and cpe genes was confirmed by PCR.
