



Rothia mucilaginosa **(Bergan and Kocur)** **Collins et al.**

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Description

Rothia mucilaginosa strain 5762/67 was isolated from a pharynx. This bacterial type strain is grown aerobically on brain heart infusion medium.

Upon thawing, the conversion of the liquid nitrogen back to its gas phase may result in the vial exploding or blowing off its cap with dangerous force creating flying debris. Unless necessary, ATCC recommends that these cultures be stored in the vapor phase of liquid nitrogen rather than submersed in liquid nitrogen.

Temperature: 37°C

Atmosphere: Aerobic

Handling Procedures

1. Open vial according to enclosed instructions or visit www.atcc.org for instructions.
2. Rehydrate the entire pellet with approximately 0.5 mL of #44 broth. Aseptically transfer the entire contents to a 5-6 mL tube of #44 broth. Additional test

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tubes can be inoculated by transferring 0.5 mL of the primary broth tube to these secondary tubes.

3. Use several drops of the primary broth tube to inoculate a #44 plate and/or #44 agar slant.
 4. Incubate at 37°C for 24 hours.
