For cultures that require storage in liquid nitrogen, it is important to note that some vials may leak when submersed in liquid nitrogen and will slowly fill with liquid nitrogen. Upon thawing, the conversion of the liquid nitrogen back to its gas phase may result in the vial exploding or blowing off its cap with dangerous force creating flying debris. Unless necessary, ATCC recommends that these cultures be stored in the vapor phase of liquid nitrogen rather than submersed in liquid nitrogen.

Growth Conditions

Medium:

ATCC Medium 526: Peptone, yeast extract agar

Temperature: 26°C

Handling Procedures

1. Open vial according to enclosed instructions.
 2. From a single tube of #526 broth (5 to 6 ml), withdraw approximately 0.5 to 1.0 ml with a Pasteur or 1.0 ml pipette and use to rehydrate the entire pellet.
 3. Aseptically transfer the rehydrated pellet back into the broth tube. Mix well.
 4. Incubate the broth tube at 26°C for 72 hours.
 5. Transfers may now be made to additional tubes of broth, a slant, and/or a plate.
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Notes

This strain is "prey-independent" which means it does not need a host bacterium for propagation. The growth in broth will not be heavy. Incubating the broth tubes enhances cell density and growth. On agar plates, the colonies are small, glistening, and yellow in color. The growth on solid medium is also slow and may take five to seven days to appear. In general, these cells do not appear as typical *Bdellovibrio*. Cells tend to be long and coiled with little motility.
