## Description

Major potato pathogen that causes Ring rot. This strain was isolated in 1996 from a potato (*Solanum tuberosum*) in Canada. **Strain designation:** NCPPB 2137 [ICMP 2535, ICPB CS101; C-1, PDDCC 2535] **Deposited As:** *Corynebacterium sepedonicum* (Spiekermann and Kotthoff) Skaptason and Burkholder **Type strain:** Yes

Upon thawing, the conversion of the liquid nitrogen back to its gas phase may result in the vial exploding or blowing off its cap with dangerous force creating flying debris. Unless necessary, ATCC recommends that these cultures be stored in the vapor phase of liquid nitrogen rather than submersed in liquid nitrogen.

Medium: ATCC Medium 86: Nutrient agar with 1% glucose Temperature: 30°C Atmosphere: Aerobic

## Handling Procedures

1. Open vial.



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- 2. Using a single tube of #86 broth (5 to 6 ml), withdraw approximately 0.5 to 1.0 ml with a Pasteur or 1.0 ml pipette. Rehydrate pellet.
- 3. Aseptically transfer this aliquot back into the broth tube. Mix well.
- 4. Use several drops of the suspension to inoculate a #86 agar slant and/or plate.
- 5. Incubate the tubes and plate at 30°C for 5 to 21 days.

#### Notes

Growth is slow with colonies becoming visible in 5 to 10 days. Full colony development requires 2 to 3 weeks.
