## **Description**

Whole-genome sequenced bacterial strain that was isolated from the stomach of a horse. This strain is cited to produce histidine decarboxylase.

Upon thawing, the conversion of the liquid nitrogen back to its gas phase may result in the vial exploding or blowing off its cap with dangerous force creating flying debris. Unless necessary, ATCC recommends that these cultures be stored in the vapor phase of liquid nitrogen rather than submersed in liquid nitrogen.

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## Growth Conditions

### Medium:

ATCC Medium 416: Lactobacilli MRS Agar/Broth

**Temperature:** 37°C

**Atmosphere:** 95% Air, 5% CO<sub>2</sub>

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## Handling Procedures

1. Open vial.
2. Rehydrate the entire pellet with approximately 0.5 mL of #416 broth.  
Aseptically transfer the entire contents to a 5-6 mL tube of #416 broth.  
Additional test tubes can be inoculated by transferring 0.5 mL of the primary

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broth tube to these secondary broth tubes.

3. Use several drops of the primary broth tube to inoculate a #416 plate and/or #416 agar slant.
4. Incubate at 37°C for 16-24 hours in an atmosphere of 5% CO<sub>2</sub>.

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### **Notes**

This strain is cited to produce histidine decarboxylase (Chang & Snell, 1968; Rosenthaler *et al.*, 1965; Guirard & Snell, 1964).
