Halorubrum sodomense strain RD-26 is a halophilic archaeon that was isolated from the Dead Sea. This strain is cited to produce bacteriorhodopsin, glucoamylase, and thermophilic extracellular amyloglucosidase.

Upon thawing, the conversion of the liquid nitrogen back to its gas phase may result in the vial exploding or blowing off its cap with dangerous force creating flying debris. Unless necessary, ATCC recommends that these cultures be stored in the vapor phase of liquid nitrogen rather than submersed in liquid nitrogen.

Handling Procedures

- 1. Open thawed vial.
- 2. Aseptically transfer the entire contents to a 5-6 mL tube of #1218 broth.



Additional test tubes can be inoculated by transferring 0.5 mL of the primary broth tube to these secondary tubes.

- 3. Use several drops of the primary broth tube to inoculate a #1218 plate and/or #1218 agar slant.
- 4. Incubate at 37°C for up to 2 weeks.
