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ATCC highly recommends that appropriate personal protective equipment is always used when handling vials. For cultures that require storage in liquid nitrogen, it is important to note that some vials may leak when submersed in liquid nitrogen and will slowly fill with liquid nitrogen. Upon thawing, the conversion of the liquid nitrogen back to its gas phase may result in the vial exploding or blowing off its cap with dangerous force creating flying debris. Unless necessary, ATCC recommends that these cultures be stored in the vapor phase of liquid nitrogen rather than submersed in liquid nitrogen.

Handling Procedures

1. Open vial according to enclosed instructions.

2. Using a single tube of #731 broth (5 to 6 ml), withdraw approximately 0.5 to 1.0 ml with a Pasteur or 1.0 ml pipette. Rehydrate the entire pellet.

3. Aseptically transfer this aliquot back into the broth tube. Mix well.

4. Transfer to a second tube and incubate the tubes at the recommended



temperature for 24 to 48 hours.

5. After growth has been achieved, additional transfers may be made to additional broth tubes and/or agar slants and plates. Or cells may be prepared for storage. Most *Vibrio*-like species will die off rapidly once the stationary phase is reached, even at refrigerator temperatures. To avoid frequent transfers, it is recommended that cells be frozen with a suitable cryoprotectant.

Notes

Two colony types were observed on #731 agar.
