Upon thawing, the conversion of the liquid nitrogen back to its gas phase may result in the vial exploding or blowing off its cap with dangerous force creating flying debris. Unless necessary, ATCC recommends that these cultures be stored in the vapor phase of liquid nitrogen rather than submersed in liquid nitrogen.

Handling Procedures

1. Open vial according to enclosed instructions.

2. Using a single tube of #1389 broth (5 to 6 ml), withdraw approximately 0.5 to 1.0 ml with a Pasteur or 1.0 ml pipette. Rehydrate pellet.

3. Aseptically transfer this aliquot back into the broth tube. Mix well.

4. Use several drops of the suspension to inoculate a #1389 agar slant and/or plate.

5. Incubate the tubes and plate at 34°C for 24 hours.

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Notes

On #1389 plates, colonies are irregular, raised, translucent, glistening, entire, and smooth. It produces beta hemolysis on #260 sheep blood agar.
