#### Handling Procedures

- 1. Open vial according to enclosed instructions.
- 2. From a single tube of #1415 broth (5 to 6 ml), withdraw approximately 0.5 to 1.0 ml with a Pasteur or 1.0 ml pipette and use to rehydrate the entire pellet.
- 3. Aseptically transfer the rehydrated pellet back into the broth tube. Mix well.
- 4. Use several drops of this suspension to inoculate an additional broth tube, an agar slant and/or plate.
- 5. Incubate the tubes and plate at 37°C for 24 hours.

#### Notes
