For cultures that require storage in liquid nitrogen, it is important to note that some vials may leak when submersed in liquid nitrogen and will slowly fill with liquid nitrogen. Upon thawing, the conversion of the liquid nitrogen back to its gas phase may result in the vial exploding or blowing off its cap with dangerous force creating flying debris. Unless necessary, ATCC recommends that these cultures be stored in the vapor phase of liquid nitrogen rather than submersed in liquid nitrogen.

Growth Conditions

Medium:

ATCC Medium 1820: LTH medium for *Thiothrix*

Temperature: 20°C

Handling Procedures

1. From a sterile stock supply of ATCC® #1820 broth, aseptically transfer 10 ml to a sterile 125 ml flask.
2. Thaw the frozen vial at room temperature.
3. Aseptically transfer the entire contents of the vial into the 125 ml flask.
4. Incubate flask at 20°C for 4-6 days.

Notes

Cells are rods and form multicellular white filaments. Cell variability is observed throughout the filaments. Cells tend to form tightly woven mats in broth. Growth on solid medium is difficult at best and can take 3 to 4 weeks. Colonies are white and rhizoid in appearance.
