ATCC highly recommends that appropriate personal protective equipment is always used when handling vials. For cultures that require storage in liquid nitrogen, it is important to note that some vials may leak when submerged in liquid nitrogen and will slowly fill with liquid nitrogen. Upon thawing, the conversion of the liquid nitrogen back to its gas phase may result in the vial exploding or blowing off its cap with dangerous force creating flying debris. Unless necessary, ATCC recommends that these cultures be stored in the vapor phase of liquid nitrogen rather than submerged in liquid nitrogen.

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## Growth Conditions

**Medium:**

ATCC Medium 1507: Supplemented Middlebrook

ATCC Medium 90: Lowenstein Jenson medium

**Temperature:** 35°C**Atmosphere:** Aerobic

## Handling Procedures

1. Open vial.
2. Rehydrate the entire pellet with approximately 0.5 mL of #1507 broth. Aseptically transfer the entire contents to a 5-6 mL tube of #1507 broth. Additional test tubes can be inoculated by transferring 0.5 mL of the primary broth tube to these secondary tubes.

3. Use several drops of the primary broth tube to inoculate a #1507 plate and/or #90 agar slant.
  4. Incubate at 35°C for 1-4 weeks.
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## Notes

Growth on solid medium may take three or four weeks to appear and is abundant on #1507. Growth on Lowenstein-Jensen or Middlebrook 7H10 is poor.
