Handling Procedures

- 1. Open vial according to enclosed instructions or visit www.atcc.org for instructions.
- Rehydrate the entire pellet with approximately 0.5 mL of #1395 broth.
 Aseptically transfer the entire contents to a 5-6 mL tube of #1395 broth.
 Additional test tubes can be inoculated by transferring 0.5 mL of the primary broth tube to these secondary tubes.
- 3. Use several drops of the primary broth tube to inoculate a #173 plate and/or #90 agar slant.
- 4. Incubate at 37°C for 3-7 days.
