Bordetella holmesii strain CIP 104395 was isolated from the dog bit wound of a human in California. This bacterial strain is grown in a 5% CO₂ atmosphere on heart infusion medium with 5% rabbit blood.

ATCC highly recommends that appropriate personal protective equipment is always used when handling vials. For cultures that require storage in liquid nitrogen, it is important to note that some vials may leak when submersed in liquid nitrogen and will slowly fill with liquid nitrogen. Upon thawing, the conversion of the liquid nitrogen back to its gas phase may result in the vial exploding or blowing off its cap with dangerous force creating flying debris. Unless necessary, ATCC recommends that these cultures be stored in the vapor phase of liquid nitrogen rather than submersed in liquid nitrogen.

Growth Conditions

Medium:

ATCC Medium 434: Heart infusion broth/agar with 5% rabbit blood

Temperature: 37°C

Atmosphere: 95% Air, 5% CO₂

Handling Procedures

1. Open vial.
2. Rehydrate the entire pellet with approximately 0.5 mL of #434 broth.
Aseptically transfer the entire contents to a 5-6 mL tube of #434 broth.
Additional test tubes can be inoculated by transferring 0.5 mL of the primary

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- broth tube to these secondary broth tubes.
3. Use several drops of the primary broth tube to inoculate a #434 plate and/or #434 agar slant.
 4. Incubate at 37°C for 1-5 days in an atmosphere of 5% CO₂.
