will slowly fill with liquid nitrogen. Upon thawing, the conversion of the liquid nitrogen back to its gas phase may result in the vial exploding or blowing off its cap with dangerous force creating flying debris. Unless necessary, ATCC recommends that these cultures be stored in the vapor phase of liquid nitrogen rather than submersed in liquid nitrogen.

Handling Procedures

- 1. Open vial according to enclosed instructions.
- 2. From a single tube of #231 broth (5 to 6 ml), withdraw approximately 0.5 to 1.0 ml with a Pasteur or 1.0 ml pipette and use to rehydrate the pellet.
- 3. Aseptically transfer the rehydrated pellet back into the broth tube. Mix well.
- 4. Use several drops of this suspension to inoculate an additional broth tube, a #231 agar slant and/or a plate.
- 5. Incubate the tubes and plate at room temperature or 26°C for 4 to 7 days.

Notes

Saprospira minor is a Gram-negative helical rod. The cells grow slowly in broth, forming a gelatinous film that tends to clump. This organism is bright yellow on solid media and displays gliding motility. After inoculating this culture into a broth, make sure some of the clumps are streaked directly on the surface of a slant.
