# Handling Procedures

- 1. Open the vial.
- 2. Rehydrate the entire pellet with approximately 0.5 mL of #416 broth.

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Aseptically transfer the entire contents to a 5-6 mL tube of #416 broth. Additional test tubes can be inoculated by transferring 0.5 mL from this primary broth tube to secondary broth tubes.

- 3. Use several drops of the suspension to inoculate a #416 agar slant and/or plate.
- 4. Incubate the tubes and plate at  $37^{\circ}$ C for 24 hours in an atmosphere of 5% CO<sub>2</sub>. Loosen the screw caps during the incubation period.
