Handling Procedures

- 1. Open vial according to enclosed instructions.
- Using a single tube of #129 broth (5 to 6 mL), withdraw approximately 0.5 to 1.0 mL with a Pasteur or 1.0 mL pipette. Rehydrate the entire pellet.
- 3. Transfer this aliquot back into the broth tube. Mix well.
- 4. Use several drops of the suspension to inoculate a #129 agar slant and/or plate.
- 5. Incubate all tubes and plate at 37°C for 24 hours.

Notes

This strain was deposited as Serovar Abortusequi (4, 12: -: enx). Luminex PCR testing

determined that its antigens are 4, 12: a: enx.
