Upon thawing, the conversion of the liquid nitrogen back to its gas phase may result in the vial exploding or blowing off its cap with dangerous force creating flying debris. Unless necessary, ATCC recommends that these cultures be stored in the vapor phase of liquid nitrogen rather than submersed in liquid nitrogen.

Medium: ATCC Medium 2497: Rhodoferax Medium Temperature: 20°C Atmosphere: Aerobic Incubation: 25 watt incandescent lamp

Handling Procedures

1. Put 6 to 8 ml of ATCC Medium #2497 into a 13x100 mm screw cap test tube (small). Add 3.0 % cysteine (stock concentration, 2 ml/100 ml medium) and then fill the test tube to capacity with additional Medium #2497. Seal the test tube with a screw cap.

2. Let the tube sit at room temperature for 30 minutes before inoculating it with the

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culture.

3. Allow the frozen vial to thaw at room temperature. Remove 0.5 ml of broth and then transfer the entire aliquot into the screw cap test tube and close tightly.

4. Incubate the culture at 18-20°C under an 25W incandescent lamp, do not use a florescent lamp. The culture should be 10 to 12 inches from the light source.
