Escherichia coli strain BL21 is a whole-genome sequenced bacterium that can be used as a host for bacteriophages T3 (ATCC BAA-1025-B1) and T7 (ATCC BAA-1025-B2).

ATCC highly recommends that appropriate personal protective equipment is always used when handling vials. For cultures that require storage in liquid nitrogen, it is important to note that some vials may leak when submersed in liquid nitrogen and will slowly fill with liquid nitrogen. Upon thawing, the conversion of the liquid nitrogen back to its gas phase may result in the vial exploding or blowing off its cap with dangerous force creating flying debris. Unless necessary, ATCC recommends that these cultures be stored in the vapor phase of liquid nitrogen rather than submersed in liquid nitrogen.

#### **Growth Conditions**

Medium:

ATCC Medium 129: Nutrient agar/stabs/broth with 0.5% NaCl

**Temperature:** 37°C **Atmosphere:** Aerobic

## Handling Procedures

- 1. Open vial according to enclosed instructions.
- 2. Using a single tube of #129 broth (5 to 6 mL), withdraw approximately 0.5 to 1.0 mL with a Pasteur or 1.0 mL pipette. Rehydrate the entire pellet.
- 3. Aseptically transfer this aliquot back into the broth tube. Mix well.
- 4. Use several drops of the suspension to inoculate a second tube of broth, a

slant, and/or plate.

5. Incubate all tubes and plate at 37°C for 24 hours.

#### Notes

This strain is used as a phage host and the above medium is recommended for phage propagation. It will grow on Nutrient Broth, Tryptic Soy Broth, or other commonly used media.

Readily produces colonial mutants.
