Upon thawing, the conversion of the liquid nitrogen back to its gas phase may result in the vial exploding or blowing off its cap with dangerous force creating flying debris. Unless necessary, ATCC recommends that these cultures be stored in the vapor phase of liquid nitrogen rather than submersed in liquid nitrogen.

Handling Procedures

1. Pull frozen vial and let thaw at room temperature..
 2. Transfer thawed cells into a single tube of #18 broth (5 to 6 ml).
 3. Use several drops of the suspension to inoculate additional tubes of broth, agar slants, and/or plate.
 4. Incubate the tubes and plate at 26°C for 24-48 hours.
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Notes
