Mammaliicoccus fleurettii strain DSM 13212 is a bacterial type strain that was isolated from cheese made from raw goat's milk in the Poitou-Charentes region of France.

ATCC highly recommends that appropriate personal protective equipment is always used when handling vials. For cultures that require storage in liquid nitrogen, it is important to note that some vials may leak when submersed in liquid nitrogen and will slowly fill with liquid nitrogen. Upon thawing, the conversion of the liquid nitrogen back to its gas phase may result in the vial exploding or blowing off its cap with dangerous force creating flying debris. Unless necessary, ATCC recommends that these cultures be stored in the vapor phase of liquid nitrogen rather than submersed in liquid nitrogen.

Medium:

ATCC Medium 18: Trypticase Soy Agar/Broth

ATCC Medium 260: Trypticase soy agar/broth with defibrinated sheep blood

Temperature: 37°C

Atmosphere: Aerobic

Handling Procedures

1. Open vial.
2. Using a single tube of #18 broth (5 to 6 ml), withdraw approximately 0.5 to 1.0 ml with a Pasteur or 1.0 ml pipette. Rehydrate the entire pellet.

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3. Aseptically transfer this aliquot back into the broth tube. Mix well.
 4. Using several drops of the suspension, inoculate a second tube of broth, a #260 slant, and/or a plate.
 5. Incubate all tubes and plate at 37°C for 24 hours.
