### Description

Enterobacter hormaechei subsp. steigerwaltii strain SC10435 was isolated in 1963 from human blood culture in Toronto, Canada. This strain is resistant to penicillins, cephalosporins, aztreonam, and pipercillin-tazobactam and it is sensitive to carbapenems. The depositor states that this strain produces a Class C, AmpC-type beta-lactamase (P99 cephalosporinase).

Unless necessary, ATCC recommends that these cultures be stored in the vapor phase of liquid nitrogen rather than submersed in liquid nitrogen.

## Handling Procedures



#### **BAA-2940**

- 1. Open thawed vial.
- 2. Aseptically transfer the entire contents to a 5-6 mL tube of #2979 broth. Additional test tubes can be inoculated by transferring 0.5 mL of the primary broth tube to these secondary tubes.
- 3. Use several drops of the primary broth tube to inoculate a #2979 plate and/or #2979 agar slant.
- 4. Incubate at 37°C for 24 hours.
