For cultures that require storage in liquid nitrogen, it is important to note that some vials may leak when submersed in liquid nitrogen and will slowly fill with liquid nitrogen. Upon thawing, the conversion of the liquid nitrogen back to its gas phase may result in the vial exploding or blowing off its cap with dangerous force creating flying debris. Unless necessary, ATCC recommends that these cultures be stored in the vapor phase of liquid nitrogen rather than submersed in liquid nitrogen.

Handling Procedures

- 1. Open vial according to enclosed instructions.
- 2. From a single tube of the recommended broth (5 to 6 ml), withdraw approximately 0.5 to 1.0 ml with a Pasteur or
 - 1.0 ml pipette and use to rehydrate the entire pellet.
- 3. Aseptically transfer the rehydrated pellet back into the broth tube. Mix well.



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- 4. Heavily inoculate a slant of #90 and/or a plate of #173 agar.
- 5. After growth has been achieved, additional transfers may be made.

Notes

Growth on solid medium requires three to five days incubation. Colonies on #173 plates are circular, and entire with convex centers. Culture will also grow on Brain Heart Infusion Agar (BD 241830).
