This drug-resistant bacterium was isolated in 2014 from the urethra of a 37-year-old male in Israel. This product can be used for all stages of the discovery and development process for novel antimicrobials and therapeutics, molecular-based detection assays, and updated sterility protocols.

Unless necessary, ATCC recommends that these cultures be stored in the vapor phase of liquid nitrogen rather than submersed in liquid nitrogen.

# Handling Procedures

1. Open thawed vial according to enclosed instructions or visit www.atcc.org for instructions

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- 2. Aseptically transfer the entire contents to a 5-6 mL tube of #814 broth.

  Additional test tubes can be inoculated by transferring 0.5 mL of the primary broth tube to these secondary tubes.
- 3. Use several drops of the primary broth tube to inoculate a #814 plate and/or #814 agar slant.
- 4. Incubate at 37°C in 5% CO<sub>2</sub> for 18-24 hours.

#### Notes

More than one colony type may be observed on the Sheep Blood agar between three to seven days.
