Unless necessary, ATCC recommends that these cultures be stored in the vapor phase of liquid nitrogen rather than

Handling Procedures

PROPAGATION PROCEDURE: Vinyl Chloride degradation:

- 2. Inoculate with 0.5 ml culture grown in ATCC® #2325.
- 3. Incubate the culture at 30°C with shaking; the doubling time on ethylene is approximately 10 hours. Good growth can normally be detected within one to four weeks depending on the inoculation size.

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On #2324 plates the colonies are entire, smooth, glistening, convex, cream-colored, small, and translucent.

Cells are non-motile rods.
