Unless necessary, ATCC recommends that these cultures be stored in the vapor phase of liquid nitrogen rather than submersed in liquid nitrogen.

Handling Procedures

- 1. Open thawed vial according to enclosed instructions or visit www.atcc.org for instructions.
- Aseptically transfer the entire contents to a 5-6 mL tube of #2402 broth.
 Additional test tubes can be inoculated by transferring 0.5 mL of the primary broth tube to these secondary tubes.
- 3. Use several drops of the primary broth tube to inoculate a #2402 plate and/or

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#2402 agar slant.4. Incubate at 37°C for 5-7 days.

Notes

No growth occurs on Nutrient, Tryptic Soy, Brain Heart Infusion, or Sheep Blood agar plates. A minimum of 150 g/L of total salt is required for growth.
