## **Description**

*Citrobacter farmeri* strain CDC 2410-97 is a drug-resistant bacterium that was isolated from human sputum in Chicago, Illinois. This strain is cited to produce extended spectrum beta-lactamase (ESBL).

ATCC highly recommends that appropriate personal protective equipment is always used when handling vials. For cultures that require storage in liquid nitrogen, it is important to note that some vials may leak when submersed in liquid nitrogen and will slowly fill with liquid nitrogen. Upon thawing, the conversion of the liquid nitrogen back to its gas phase may result in the vial exploding or blowing off its cap with dangerous force creating flying debris. Unless necessary, ATCC recommends that these cultures be stored in the vapor phase of liquid nitrogen rather than submersed in liquid nitrogen.

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## Growth Conditions

**Medium:**

ATCC Medium 18: Trypticase Soy Agar/Broth

**Temperature:** 37°C**Atmosphere:** Aerobic

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## Handling Procedures

1. Open vial.
2. From a single tube of #18 broth (5 to 6 ml), withdraw approximately 0.5 to 1.0 ml with a Pasteur or 1.0 ml pipette and use to rehydrate the entire pellet.
3. Aseptically transfer the rehydrated pellet back into the broth tube. Mix well.

4. Use several drops of this suspension to inoculate an additional broth tube, a #18 agar slant and/or a plate.
  5. Incubate the tubes and plate at 37°C for 24 hours.
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## Notes

On #18 plates colonies are entire, glistening, smooth, and convex. Cells are motile short rods, stained Gram negative, occurring singly or in pairs.
