Upon thawing, the conversion of the liquid nitrogen back to its gas phase may result in the vial exploding or blowing off its cap with dangerous force creating flying debris. Unless necessary, ATCC recommends that these cultures be stored in the vapor phase of liquid nitrogen rather than submersed in liquid nitrogen.

# Handling Procedures

- 1. Open the vial according to enclosed instructions.
- 2. From a tube of #1097 broth (5 to 6 ml), withdraw approximately 0.5 with a sterile pipette; add this medium to the vial to rehydrate the entire pellet.
- 3. Aseptically transfer the contents of the vial into the broth tube. Mix well.
- 4. Use several drops of the suspension to inoculate a #1097 agar slant and/or plate.
- 5. Incubate all tubes and plate at 30°C for 24 hours.

#### Notes

Colonies on #1097 plates are creamy, convex, glistening, circular and entire. Under the microscope, cells are motile rods found singles or in pairs.
