

LitR Repression Pair (TetR Homolog)

Description

A plasmid pair from the ATCC® Synthetic Biology Yeast Tool Kit that is used to construct a gene expression system via a TetR homolog-based repression system. LitR, a TetR homolog, is a transcriptional regulator from *Vibrio* bacteria. This pair of product includes two plasmids: pENTR_L1L2_ LitR contains a TetR homolog, LitR, (ATCC SB-1089) and pENTR_L4R1_ pGPD-LitR contains an ATCC synthetic promoter, pGPD- LitR, (ATCC SB-1069). They are two of DNA parts in the ATCC Synthetic Biology Yeast Tool Kit for building gene circuits in yeast, *Saccharomyces cerevisiae*. Upon thawing, the conversion of the liquid nitrogen back to its gas phase may result in the vial exploding or blowing off its cap with dangerous force creating flying debris. Unless necessary, ATCC recommends that these cultures be stored in the vapor phase of liquid nitrogen rather than submersed in liquid nitrogen.

Handling Procedures



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Before opening the vial, centrifuge at 6,000 x g for 30 seconds. Add 30 μ L of Molecular Grade Water and incubate the vial at 4°C overnight to dissolve the DNA. Each vial contains 2-3 μ g plasmid DNA (measured by PicoGreen® dsDNA quantitation assay).
