# Handling Procedures

- 1. Thaw the vial at room temperature and immediately place on ice. Avoid exposing the RNA to repeated freeze-thaw cycles as it may result in degradation.
- 2. Gently mix the sample to ensure an even distribution of material.
- 3. Briefly centrifuge the tube before opening to ensure all liquid is at the bottom.

# Notes

RNA is easily degraded. Take extra precautions against contamination by using new gloves and clean lab coats when working with RNA. Use only RNase-free lab materials when handling this product. Vortexing can damage RNA. Gentle pipetting is highly recommended. Aliquoting is highly recommended to avoid multiple freeze-thaws, which can damage RNA.
