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ATCC highly recommends that appropriate personal protective equipment is always used when handling vials. Upon thawing, the conversion of the liquid nitrogen back to its gas phase may result in the vial exploding or blowing off its cap with dangerous force creating flying debris. Unless necessary, ATCC recommends that these cultures be stored in the vapor phase of liquid nitrogen rather than submersed in liquid nitrogen.

Growth Conditions

Host: MDCK-SIAT1 cells (Sigma 05071502-1VL)
Effects: refractile cell rounding; cell detachment
Complete medium: DMEM (ATCC 30-2002) + 0.3% BSA +5 μg/mL N-acetyl trypsin
Temperature: 33°C

Recommendations for infection: Plate cells 24-48 hours prior to infection and infect when cultures are 80-100% confluent. Remove medium and inoculate with a small volume of virus (e.g. 1 mL per 25 cm²) diluted to provide an optimal MOI (e.g. 0.001). Adsorb 1 hour stationary at 33°C in a humidified 5% CO₂ atmosphere. End adsorption by adding virus growth medium.

Incubation: 3-4 days at 33°C in a humidified 5% CO₂ atmosphere. Do not move infected flasks. MDCK-SIAT cells are sensitive to movement after infection.
