Description

Feline immunodeficiency virus strain Petaluma (infected CRFK cells) is continuously produced by the cell line in which it is shipped. This virus was isolated in 1999 from the blood of a domestic cat with acquired immunodeficiency-like syndrome.

Storage Conditions

Product format: Frozen

Storage conditions: Vapor phase of liquid nitrogen

Intended Use

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ATCC highly recommends that appropriate personal protective equipment is always used when handling vials. For cultures that require storage in liquid nitrogen, it is important to note that some vials may leak when submersed in liquid nitrogen and will slowly fill with liquid nitrogen. Upon thawing, the conversion of the liquid nitrogen back to its gas phase may result in the vial exploding or blowing off its cap with dangerous force creating flying debris. Unless necessary, ATCC recommends that these cultures be stored in the vapor phase of liquid nitrogen rather than submersed in liquid nitrogen.

Growth Conditions

Host: This virus is continuously produced by the cell line in which it is shipped. No additional host is required, however, if desired, the virus may be used to infect other cells, which are listed as alternate hosts.

Effects: No CPE

Complete medium: 30-2003 (ATCC 30-2020) + 2% FBS (ATCC 30-2020)

Temperature: 37°C

Incubation: 3 to 7 days at 37°C in a humidified 5% CO₂ atmosphere.

ATCC VR-3434 is persistently infected in Crandell-Rees feline kidney cells and growth of this item should be treated as a cell line.
