Upon thawing, the conversion of the liquid nitrogen back to its gas phase may result in the vial exploding or blowing off its cap with dangerous force creating flying debris. Unless necessary, ATCC recommends that these cultures be stored in the vapor phase of liquid nitrogen rather than submersed in liquid nitrogen.

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## Growth Conditions

**Medium:**

ATCC Medium 0196: Yeast malt extract medium ISP #2

**Temperature:** 26°C

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## Handling Procedures

1. Open vial according to the enclosed instructions.
2. Using a single tube of ISP #1877 broth (5 to 6 ml), withdraw approximately 0.5 ml to 1.0 ml with a Pasteur or 1.0 ml pipette. Rehydrate the entire

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pellet.

3. Aseptically transfer this aliquot back into the broth tube and mix well.
  4. Use several drops of the cell suspension to inoculate a second tube of broth, a slant and/or a plate.
  5. Incubate all tubes and plate at 26°C for 48 hours.
