Unless necessary, ATCC recommends that these cultures be stored in the vapor phase of liquid nitrogen rather than submersed in liquid nitrogen.

ATCC Medium 104: PDA and yeast medium

**Temperature:** 26°C

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## **Handling Procedures**

1. Open vial according to enclosed instructions or visit [www.atcc.org](http://www.atcc.org) for instructions.

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2. Aseptically rehydrate the contents with approximately 0.5 mL of #104 broth. Transfer the entire contents to a 5-6 mL tube of #104 broth. Additional test tubes can be inoculated by transferring 0.5 mL of the primary broth tube to these secondary tubes.
  3. Use several drops of the primary broth tube to inoculate a #104 plate and/or #104 agar slant.
  4. Incubate at 26°C for 7 days.
