Upon thawing, the conversion of the liquid nitrogen back to its gas phase may result in the vial exploding or blowing off its cap with dangerous force creating flying debris. Unless necessary, ATCC recommends that these cultures be stored in the vapor phase of liquid nitrogen rather than submersed in liquid nitrogen.

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## **Growth Conditions**

### **Medium:**

ATCC Medium 5129: Haemophilus Test Medium

ATCC Medium 814: GC Agar/Broth Medium

**Temperature:** 37°C

**Atmosphere:** 95% Air, 5% CO<sub>2</sub>

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## **Handling Procedures**

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1. Open vial according to enclosed instructions.
2. Using a single tube of #5129 (5-6 mL), withdraw 0.5 to 1.0 mL with a Pasteur or 1.0 ml pipette. Rehydrate the entire pellet. Aseptically transfer this aliquot back into the broth tube. Mix well.
3. Aseptically transfer 0.2 mL of this suspension to additional #5129 broth tubes, #814 slant(s) and/or 0.1 mL to plates.
4. Incubate tubes and plates at 37°C in an atmosphere of 5% CO<sub>2</sub>.
5. Within 24-48 hours, growth is evident by colonies on the agar surfaces. Cells are Gram negative, short coccoid rods.

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## **Notes**

Colonies are small, circular, entire, flat, and gray.
