For cultures that require storage in liquid nitrogen, it is important to note that some vials may leak when submersed in liquid nitrogen and will slowly fill with liquid nitrogen. Upon thawing, the conversion of the liquid nitrogen back to its gas phase may result in the vial exploding or blowing off its cap with dangerous force creating flying debris. Unless necessary, ATCC recommends that these cultures be stored in the vapor phase of liquid nitrogen rather than submersed in liquid nitrogen.

Growth Conditions

Medium:

ATCC Medium 1661: M13 Verrucomicrobium medium

Temperature: 30°C

Handling Procedures

- 1. Open vial according to enclosed instructions.**
- 2. Using a single tube of #1661 broth (5 to 6 ml), withdraw approximately 0.5 to 1.0 ml with a Pasteur or glass pipet. Rehydrate the pellet.**
- 3. Transfer this aliquot back into the broth tube. Mix well.**
- 4. Use several drops of the suspension to inoculate a second tube of broth, a slant, and/or plate.**

5. Incubate all tubes and plate at 30°C for 72 to 96 hours.

Notes

Growth will develop in 3 to 4 days. Colonies are small (some variation in size may be noted), entire, glistening, and smooth. Broth will be turbid. Cells under phase microscopy display numerous conical prosthecae which give the cells a warty appearance. Fimbriae extrude from the tips of these prosthecae. Cells are non-motile.
