Upon thawing, the conversion of the liquid nitrogen back to its gas phase may result in the vial exploding or blowing off its cap with dangerous force creating flying debris. Unless necessary, ATCC recommends that these cultures be stored in the vapor phase of liquid nitrogen rather than submersed in liquid nitrogen.

ATCC Medium 338: Potato sucrose agar

Temperature: 24°C

Handling Procedures

Morphology: After 5 to 7 days colonies grow rapidly on potato sucrose medium with floccose aerial hyphae which are usually yellow and later develop a red pigment. Conidiospores are formed laterally. Abundant macroconidia with 3 to 5 septa are produced. Chlamydospores are slightly curved and are terminal or intercalary.
