For cultures that require storage in liquid nitrogen, it is important to note that some vials may leak when submerged in liquid nitrogen and will slowly fill with liquid nitrogen. Upon thawing, the conversion of the liquid nitrogen back to its gas phase may result in the vial exploding or blowing off its cap with dangerous force creating flying debris. Unless necessary, ATCC recommends that these cultures be stored in the vapor phase of liquid nitrogen rather than submerged in liquid nitrogen.

Medium:ATCC Medium 1723: Revised *Sulfolobus* medium**Temperature:** 75°C**Atmosphere:** Aerobic

Handling Procedures

1. Thaw vial and aseptically transfer the entire suspension into a tube of #1723 broth and mix well. Take 0.5 ml of the suspension and transfer to a second tube of broth. Incubate tubes at 75°C.
2. Plate out a portion of the suspension onto a non-selective medium and incubate aerobically at 37°C to test for purity.
3. After two to three days, growth is indicated by turbidity that settles to the

bottom of the test tube and is easily resuspended when the test tube is inverted. When examined microscopically the cells appear as large cocci, generally as single cells sometimes as pairs.

Notes

The culture will remain viable for up to one week when stored at room temperature. Use a large inoculum (10% or greater) for subsequent transfers. Growth is detectable within 24 hours and no later than 72 hours.
