Lancefieldella rimae strain VPI D140H-11A [NCFB 2896] is a whole-genome sequenced bacterial type strain that was isolated from a human gingival crevice. This strain was sequenced as a reference genome for the NIH Human Microbiome Project.

ATCC highly recommends that appropriate personal protective equipment is always used when handling vials. For cultures that require storage in liquid nitrogen, it is important to note that some vials may leak when submersed in liquid nitrogen and will slowly fill with liquid nitrogen. Upon thawing, the conversion of the liquid nitrogen back to its gas phase may result in the vial exploding or blowing off its cap with dangerous force creating flying debris. Unless necessary, ATCC recommends that these cultures be stored in the vapor phase of liquid nitrogen rather than submersed in liquid nitrogen.

Handling Procedures

- 1. Open vial according to enclosed instructions.
- 2. Under anaerobic conditions (see below), withdraw 0.5 mL of recommended



broth from a single test tube (5 to 6 mL) and rehydrate the entire vial contents.

- 3. Aseptically transfer this aliquot back into the broth tube. A slant and a #1482 or pre-reduced blood plate may also be inoculated with 0.1 mL each of the cell suspension. An aerobic blood plate may also be streaked to check for purity.
- 4. Incubate tubes and plate under anaerobic conditions at 37°C for 2-5 days. Incubate blood plate aerobically at 37°C.

ANAEROBIC CONDITIONS:

Anaerobic conditions for transfer may be obtained by either of the following:

- Use of an anaerobic gas chamber, or
- Placement of test tubes under a gassing cannula system hooked to anaerobic gas.

Anaerobic conditions for incubation may be obtained by any of the following:

- Loose screw caps on test tubes in anaerobic chamber,
- Loose screw caps on test tubes in an activated anaerobic gas pack jar, or
- Use of sterile butyl rubber stoppers on test tubes so that an anaerobic gas headspace is retained.

Notes

Anaerobe Systems Brucella Blood plate (AS-111 or AS-141) can be used to analyze colony morphology and purity.
