



# *Bacillus spizizenii* (Nakamura et al. 1999) Dunlap et al. 2020

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## Description

This item is used in sterility testing and assay of rifampin [rifampicin, rifamycin AMP], neomycin, monensin, kanamycin, lasalocid [X-537A], mitomycin [mitomycin C], vancomycin, novobiocin, penicillin, framycetin, tobramycin, spiramycin, gentamicins [gentamicin], amoxicillin, bekanamycin [kanamycin B; aminodeoxykanamycin], hygromycin B, streptomycin, erythromycin, dactinomycin [actinomycin; actinomycin D], streptonigrin, lactam antibiotics [beta-lactam antibiotics], capreomycin sulfate [capreomycin], and dihydrostreptomycin sulfate [dihydrostreptomycin]. Susceptibility disc testing of rifampin [rifampicin; rifamycin AMP] and novobiocin. Produces restriction endonuclease *Bsu6633I* and subtilin.

Unless necessary, ATCC recommends that these cultures be stored in the vapor phase of liquid nitrogen rather than submersed in liquid nitrogen.

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## Growth Conditions

**Medium:**

ATCC Medium 44: Brain Heart Infusion Agar/Broth

**Temperature:** 30°C

**Atmosphere:** Aerobic

**Incubation:** Using a shaking incubator improves growth

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## Handling Procedures

1. Open vial according to enclosed instructions.
  2. Using a single tube of #44 broth (5 to 6 mL), withdraw approximately 0.5 to 1.0 mL with a Pasteur or 1.0 mL pipette. Rehydrate the entire pellet.
  3. Aseptically transfer this aliquot back into the broth tube. Mix well.
  4. Use several drops of the suspension to inoculate a #44 agar slant and/or plate.
  5. Incubate the tubes and plate at 30°C for 24 hours.
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## Notes

CA Dunlap et al. reclassified *Bacillus subtilis* subsp. *spizizenii* into the new species *Bacillus spizizenii*. Some platforms and databases may still identify this species by its previous name.
