# Description

Canine distemper virus strain Lederle is a paramyxovirus that was isolated from a dog with distemper encephalitis. This strain is propagated in SL-29 cells (ATCC CRL-1590). The strain belongs to the same virus subgroup as measles and rinderpest and can be used in infectious disease and respiratory disease research.

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ATCC highly recommends that appropriate personal protective equipment is always used when handling vials. For cultures that require storage in liquid nitrogen, it is important to note that some vials may leak when submersed in liquid nitrogen and will slowly fill with liquid nitrogen. Upon thawing, the conversion of the liquid nitrogen back to its gas phase may result in the vial exploding or blowing off its cap with dangerous force creating flying debris. Unless necessary, ATCC recommends that these cultures be stored in the vapor phase of liquid nitrogen rather than submersed in liquid nitrogen.

#### **Growth Conditions**

Host: SL-29 (ATCC CRL-1590)

Effects: cell degeneration; cell rounding; CPE

**Complete medium:** 

EMEM (ATCC 30-2003) + 5% FBS (ATCC 30-2020) + 5% TPB + 1% NEAA (ATCC 30-2116)

+ 25 mM HEPES **Temperature:** 37°C

**Atmosphere:** 95% Air, 5% CO<sub>2</sub>

**Recommendations for infection:** Plate cells 24-48 hours prior to infection and infect when cultures are 70-90% confluent. Remove medium and inoculate with a small volume of virus (e.g. 1 mL per 25 cm²) diluted to provide an optimal MOI (e.g. 0.1). Adsorb 1-2 hours at 37°C in a humidified 5%  $CO_2$  atmosphere, rocking every 20-30 minutes to redistribute inoculum. End adsorption by adding virus growth medium.

**Incubation:** 5-8 days. Replace virus growth medium every 2-3 days.
