Propagation Procedure

1. Open vial according to enclosed instructions or visit www.atcc.org for instructions.
2. Rehydrate the entire pellet with approximately 0.5 mL of #212 broth. Aseptically transfer the entire contents to a 5-6 mL tube of #212 broth. Additional test tubes can be inoculated by transferring 0.5 mL of the primary broth tube to these secondary tubes.
3. Use several drops of the primary broth tube to inoculate a #212 plate and/or #212 agar slant.
4. Incubate at 37°C for 24 hours.

Notes
